THE VILLA HOLIDAY HAS COME OF AGE, THANKS TO A GROWING CHOICE OF VILLA STYLES AND SIZES IN BEAUTIFUL, UNFAMILIAR LOCATIONS. READ ON TO DISCOVER THE PERFECT ONE FOR YOU IN 2016

omespun farmhouse, beachside hipster hangout, palatial country estate - these days, not only is there a huge choice of villa styles and sizes but they are cropping up in wonderfully unexpected locations, far from the madding crowds of the Riviera and the popular Mediterranean islands.

Italy is the place that particularly wins our hearts, say the villa specialists, but we no longer confine ourselves to a farmhouse in Tuscany or Umbria. Puglia, for example, in the rural, sunbleached 'heel' of Italy's 'boot', is home to clusters of strange agricultural houses with beehive-shaped roofs known as *trulli*. Oliver's Travels offers a charming, design-conscious example, Villa Trullo (above), which sleeps eight and sits on its own beautifully tended estate, where you can pick your own fruit. For something grander, consider a *masseria*, an imposing fortified farmhouse that is unique to Puglia. These magnificent buildings are blessedly cool in the heat and are often only a 10-minute drive from the sea or the region's loveliest cities, such as Lecce. CV Villas and The Thinking

Traveller both offer a superb selection. You can even book an entire *borgo* (a small village or hamlet) in Italy these days - ideal for the kind of large 'multigenerational' gatherings that more of us are seeking, says Francis Torrilla of CV Villas. And, when it comes to discovering the local region, if walking tours are a little old-hat for you, the team at Red Savannah has devised some more interesting ways to see Italy's great cities, from exploring Chianti by Harley Davidson to zipping around Florence by Segway.

Beyond Italy, more of us want villas in quiet locations and on smaller, lesser-known islands in the Mediterranean. Menorca in Spain, and Ithaca, Andros and Paxos in Greece typify this shift. And while some of us want absolute luxury and a complete break from domestic chores, we don't necessarily want to laze by the pool all day. Hence the emergence of the 'supervilla', which combines a dreamy location and five-star luxury, with a dedicated concierge service and an army of chefs, drivers, maids and nannies – and even nutritionists, tour guides, tennis coaches, Pilates instructors, personal trainers and tutors. No request is too outlandish.
